

# Fewer Births — Rockefeller

CHAPEL HILL (AP) — A prompt reduction in population growth would help considerably in meeting environmental and social problems of the nation, John D. Rockefeller 3rd, chairman of the U.S. Commission on Population Growth and the American Future, said today.

"Demands for governmental services will be less than they would otherwise be, and resources available to finance governmental activities great," Rockefeller said.

On Friday, Rockefeller will attend a dinner on the campus of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He will be joined by other members of the U.S. Commission on Population Growth and the American Future, and by Duke University President Terry Sanford.

"However, it would be a serious error to read these conclusions as comforting and reassuring. Under the assumptions, at more people will be added to the U.S. population in the next 25 years than in the past 25 years, demands on governmental services and making a political process contemporary conditions are more complex and governmental structures already stressed — many would be overburdened — by the problems facing the nation."

# Sanford Calls For Control

Duke University President Terry Sanford has added his name to a growing number of public and private officials calling for a comprehensive statewide land use planning program. Uncontrolled, haphazard development of land and untended population growth go hand in hand, says Sanford, and ought to be given prompt attention by the state of North Carolina. If not, he says, North Carolina may find itself in the critical situation confronting a number of other states in a matter of a few short years.

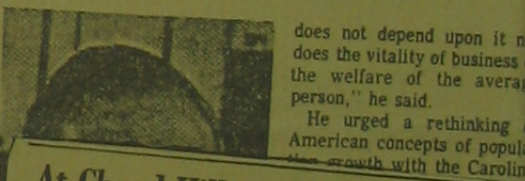
