

Examples of “Code 2 Individuals” in the 1994 and 2000 Survey Data

One Typical Code 2 Individual in the 1994 Survey on Two Household Rosters

Below is an example of a code 2 individual in 1994 (highlighted in yellow), who is listed on two different household rosters – an origin household and a destination household:

Origin Household (HHID94=20040311)

Some things to note:

1. In the origin household, the code 2 individual is always listed on Form 1 (**FORM=1**) and coded as '2' on the **Q1** variable. Further, the origin household is always an old household (**HHTYPE94=1**). In the destination household, the code 2 individual is either **Q1=1** (moved to a new household) or **Q1=4** (moved into another old household and listed on Form 2).
2. The tracking variables in the origin household show that this person was indeed tracked (**CODE2=1**) and verified to be living in a destination household (**DHHID94=20040772** & **DCEP94=502**).
3. The code 2 individual's 1984 and 2000 identifiers are exactly the same in the origin and destination households.
4. The age, **Q2**, of this individual is different across the origin and destination households, 30 and 32 respectively. This is not unusual, but if the ages are not exactly the same then they are usually within three years of each other.

One Code 2 Individual “Living in a Temple” in the 1994 Survey

Below is an example of a code 2 individual in 1994 (highlighted in yellow), who is listed on one household roster only, since he was living at a temple in the village at the time of the interview. The tracking variables in the origin household are coded with a 6 and 96's to show that this person moved to a temple (**CODE2=6**, **DHHID94=99999996** & **DCEP94=996**).

One Code 2 Individual “Missing on Destination” in the 1994 Survey

Below is an example of a code 2 individual in 1994 (highlighted in yellow), who is listed on one household roster only, since her destination household could not be verified by the field supervisors. The tracking variables in the origin household are coded with a 9 and 99's to show that the destination household is missing or unknown (**CODE2=9**, **DHHID94=99999999** & **DCEP94=999**).

One Typical Code 2 Individual in the 2000 Survey on Two Household Rosters

Below is an example of a code 2 individual in 2000 (highlighted in yellow), who is listed on two different household rosters – an origin household and a destination household:

Some things to note:

1. In the origin household, the code 2 individual is always listed on Form 1 (**FORM=1**) and coded as ‘2’ on the **X1** variable. Further, the origin household is always an old household (**HHTYPE00=1**). In the destination household, the code 2 individual is either **X1=1** (moved to a new household) or **X1=4** (moved into another old household and listed on Form 2).
2. The tracking variables in the origin household show that this person was indeed tracked (**CODE2=1**) and verified to be in a destination household (**DHHID00=020809066** & **DCEP00=05**).
3. The code 2 individual’s 1984 and 1994 identifiers are exactly the same in the origin and destination households.
4. The age, **X3**, of this individual is different across the origin and destination households, 24 and 25 respectively. This is not unusual, but if the ages are not exactly the same then they are usually within three years of each other.

One Code 2 Individual “Living in a Temple” in the 2000 Survey

Below is an example of a code 2 individual in 2000 (highlighted in yellow), who is listed on one household roster only, since he was living at a temple in the village at the time of the interview. The tracking variables in the origin household are coded with a 7 and 77's to show that this person moved to a temple (**CODE2=7**, **DHHID00=020503777** & **DCEP00=77**).

Two Code 2 Individuals “Missing on Destination” in the 2000 Survey

Below is an example of two code 2 individuals in 2000 (highlighted in yellow), who are listed on one household roster only, since their destination household could not be verified by the field supervisors. Two of the three tracking variables in the origin household are coded with a 9 and 99 to show that the destination household is missing or unknown (**CODE2=9**, **DHHID00=020503137** & **DCEP00=99**).
