## Community

- **87** Faculty Fellows across **19** departments in six schools (CAS, Gillings School of Global Public Health, School of Medicine, Eshelman School of Pharmacy, School of Education, School of Data Science and Society)
  - **19** are tenure-track Assistant Professors
  - **5** serve as Department Chair (plus **5** former Chairs), **2** as Associate Chairs, and **8** as Directors of Undergraduate or Graduate Studies
  - **≈50%** of Fellows teach at least one undergraduate or graduate course in a given semester
- **47** predoctoral trainees across **10** departments
  - **≈50** additional Graduate Research Assistants and student workers
- **10** postdoctoral scholars
- **73** permanent and **9** temporary staff

## Current Portfolio

- Total received & anticipated for currently funded projects: **\$158 million** across **58** projects headed by **32** Principal Investigators (PI)
- Majority involve Co-Investigators across multiple departments
- Funders include **six** National Institute of Health (NIH) and National Science Foundation (NSF) grants and multiple foundations
- Since Feb 2025: **93** external applications by **44** PIs totaling **\$156 million**
- **24** projects already funded: **\$16 million**

## Signature Projects

### National Longitudinal Study of Adolescent to Adult Health (Add Health):

- Six waves (1994-95, 1996, 2001-02, 2008-09, 2016-18, 2022-25)
- \$200 million + direct + indirect costs across 25 federal institutes/agencies
- Wave VII application (sole-source Request for Applications) under review in April; total direct + indirect: \$65.5 million
- 2016 Golden Goose Award (U.S. Congress)

### Add Health Parent Study:

- Two waves (2013-18, 2023-28)
- Total funding: \$36.7 million

## History

- Established in 1966
- Training program established in 1972

## Umbrella Organization

- Carolina Center for Population Health and Aging (CCPAH)
- Carolina Demography (applied unit)
- Triangle Research Data Center (TRDC), a branch of the Federal Statistical Research Data Centers

## Global Food Research Program:

- Since 2010
- Funded by a \$30 million grant from Bloomberg Philanthropies

## Study of the Tsunami Aftermath and Recovery (STAR):

- Eight waves
- Funded by NIH, NSF, World Bank, MacArthur, Wellcome Trust
- Wave 9 under review - National Institute on Aging (NIA) & National Institute of Child Health and Development (NICHD)

## Transfer Project:

- Since 2008
- Collaboration with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), national governments & local research partners

## Infrastructure Support

- NICHD Population Dynamics Branch (since 2005)
  - One of 17 NICHD-funded population research centers, all sited on their university's main campus
- NIA Centers on the Demography & Economics of Aging (since 2020)
  - One of 13 NIA-funded population research centers
- Since 2016, this infrastructure support has funded 48 pilot projects totaling more than \$1.1 million

### Training Programs

- **Two** T32 training programs, both funded by the NICHD Population Dynamics Branch
  - Population Sciences since **1972**
  - Biosocial since **2017**
- Since 1972, **750+** predoctoral trainees and **90** postdoctoral trainees

### In-Person Activities

- Friday Interdisciplinary Seminar Series (**18-20** talks per academic year)
- Alternate hosting of “Demography Daze” with Duke University Population Research Institute
- **2-4** grant development workshops per semester
- **2-3** substantive workshops on aspects of the research process and external funding
- Weekly professional development workshops for trainees and postdocs
- Multiple meetings for research area groups and project teams

### Outreach by Carolina Demography

- Work with stakeholders across North Carolina to provide demographic insights
  - Clients include: myFutureNC, John M. Belk Endowment, NC Metro Mayors Coalition, NC Assoc. of County Commissioners, Orange County Schools, Suicide Prevention Institute
  - **\$1.2 million** in projected revenue in FY 2026
